GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Expectations of Pilgrims

Items to bring:

- Sleeping: Two flat sheets, pillow case; bath towel, wash rag,
- Toiletries: deodorant, shampoo, bath soap, shower cap; toothpaste; toothbrush; mouthwash / floss
- Personal Items: to include Sanitary napkins; underwear; undershirt; socks;
- Clothing: comfortable jeans, t-shirts, swim suits; to include something suitable for church, and the opening ceremony; sneakers running shoes; dress shoes;
- Umbrella / raincoat; flash light and batteries; insect repellant
- Medical supplies: Personal medication with repeat if applicable and medical history if necessary; (fill out the Medical Information Form)
- Bible, rosary and your personal prayer material.

2. Accommodation

Should you plan on arriving early or leaving later please advise us accordingly. These arrangements would have to be made separately.

Pilgrims will be placed in homes with host families as well as institutions throughout the dioceses of Kingston and Mandeville during the days in the Parishes (July 9 - 14). During the Catechetical Days pilgrims will be housed in the Archdiocese of Kingston in homes and institutions.

Adults accompanying pilgrims should be in a ratio of one in 15.

Clergy and religious sisters will be housed in convents and rectories.

3. Insurance for pilgrims

Each group is responsible for your own medical and travel insurances. The Archdiocese of Kingston will provide accident and peril.

4. Travel Arrangements

You are being advised to as far as is humanly possible arrive and depart from Norman Manley International Airport (NMIA) – Kingston, Jamaica.

Pilgrims will be met at the airport and transported to their destinations from the July $9 - 20^{th}$.

5. Communication

An internet café will be set-up for pilgrims to contact their families at set hours.



6. Meals

Meals will be provided for all pilgrims throughout the Assembly. During the Catechetical Days pilgrims will receive their meals packaged in groups of 10.



7. Registration

Countries are to appoint **two persons** to register the pilgrims in their group. These are the only persons necessary in the registration area.

Registration Fee to be paid in US dollars. Registration deadline: April 15, 2009

Cheques are to be made payable to the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Kingston

8. Head of delegation

One person is to be appointed as head of their delegation. This person must be an adult and will be the contact person for all communication once in the island. This will help in the case of medical emergency, etc.

9. Medical

To appoint a person that all medical-related matters regarding pilgrims will be addressed. Doctors and other medical related persons will be on call. Sick Bay is located at all sites.

Fill out the attached <u>medical information form</u> and take along with you to the registration area.

10. Prayer of the Assembly (EVERY DAY)

Father of mercy and love, as we, the youth of the Caribbean, gather together for our AEC Youth Assembly 2009, We give you thanks and praise for the gift of life. Teach us to respect and celebrate life each day. Grant us the grace to be faithful stewards of the gift we have received and to follow Christ as His disciples.
